- Typical structure of passive voice: object turned subject + 'be+3rd form' + by + original subject + ...

The applications were mailed by the candidates.

## Session 17

### ❑ Structure 'be + 5th form' and Complements

❖ Word Families: 'field', 'die', 'being', 'toe', 'peon' & 'euro'

❖ 'be + 5th form'

- 'Be' and 5th form (adjective/adverb) of a verb unite to make the structure for continuous tense.
- In continuous tense, 'be + being (5th form of be) + 3rd form' is used in passive voice.

❖ **Complements**

- Verbs of incomplete predication. 

John <i>is</i> ___?__ . We <i>are</i> ___?__ . She <i>seems</i> ___?__ . You <i>look</i> ___?__ . I <i>have</i> ___?__ . ....
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- Complements: words/phrases complementing the verbs of incomplete predication.

playing, in danger, alone, good, eaten.....

### ❑ Supporting Verbs 'do' and 'be'

#### ❖ Word Families: 'due-cheque', 'new' & 'key'

#### ❖ 'do' and 'be'

- 'do' in support of another verb 

Why <u>do</u> you <u>cry</u> ?
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- 'be' taking support of 'do' 

Do not be sad.
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- 'be' NOT taking support of 'do' 

I am not sad.
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- 'be' in support of another verb 

We were taught/teaching.
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- 'be' in support of 'do' 

Rakesh is doing his work.

❖ List 5 of common verbs.

❖ Verb ‘have’

➤ The meaning varies according to the context.

I have a book.

Children have many ideas.

We will have a party.

❖ Sentences in 46 types

Active + Passive	Present + Past + Future	Simple + Continuous	Positive + Negative+ Interrogative + Query	Imperative (Positive + Negative)
$[ \{ (2*3*2) - 1 \} * 4 + 2 ] = 46$				
(-1) for no future continuous in passive

### ☐ Verbs: Objects and Alternative Meanings; Summarising Strategy

❖ **A list of a hundred verbs**

- No object – arise, live, sleep .....
- One object – break, kill, drink .....
- Two objects – give, ask, show .....
- Verb meanings as nouns: play, order, drop, stay .....
- Verb meanings as adjectives: close, live, light, open ....

L	O	A	D	E	R
