

Bid Corrigendum

GEM/2025/B/6396717-C5

Following terms and conditions supersede all existing "Buyer added Bid Specific Terms and conditions" given in the bid document or any previous corrigendum. Prospective bidders are advised to bid as per following Terms and Conditions:

Buyer Added Bid Specific Additional Terms and Conditions

1. **OPTION CLAUSE:** The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 25 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. The purchaser also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity up to 25% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at the contracted rates. The delivery period of quantity shall commence from the last date of original delivery order and in cases where option clause is exercised during the extended delivery period the additional time shall commence from the last date of extended delivery period. The additional delivery time shall be $(\text{Increased quantity} \div \text{Original quantity}) \times \text{Original delivery period (in days)}$, subject to minimum of 30 days. If the original delivery period is less than 30 days, the additional time equals the original delivery period. The Purchaser may extend this calculated delivery duration up to the original delivery period while exercising the option clause. Bidders must comply with these terms.
2. Bidders are advised to check applicable GST on their own before quoting. Buyer will not take any responsibility in this regards. GST reimbursement will be as per actuals or as per applicable rates (whichever is lower), subject to the maximum of quoted GST %.
3. Bidders shall quote only those products (Part of Service delivery) in the bid which are not obsolete in the market and has at least 2 years residual market life i.e. the offered product shall not be declared end-of-life by the OEM before this period.
4. **Bidder financial standing:** The bidder should not be under liquidation, court receivership or similar proceedings, should not be bankrupt. Bidder to upload undertaking to this effect with bid.
5. Data Sheet of the product(s) offered in the bid, are to be uploaded along with the bid documents. Buyers can match and verify the Data Sheet with the product specifications offered. In case of any unexplained mismatch of technical parameters, the bid is liable for rejection.
6. **Experience Criteria:** The Bidder or its OEM {themselves or through reseller(s)} should have regularly, manufactured and supplied same or similar Category Products to any Central / State Govt Organization / PSU for 3 years before the bid opening date. Copies of relevant contracts to be submitted along with bid in support of having supplied some quantity during each of the year. In case of bunch bids, the primary product having highest value should meet this criterion.
7. Installation, Commissioning, Testing, Configuration, Training (if any - which ever is applicable as per scope of supply) is to be carried out by OEM / OEM Certified resource or OEM authorised Reseller.
8. **Manufacturer Authorization:** Wherever Authorised Distributors/service providers are submitting the bid, Authorisation Form /Certificate with OEM/Original Service Provider details such as name, designation, address, e-mail Id and Phone No. required to be furnished along with the bid
9. Supplier shall ensure that the Invoice is raised in the name of Consignee with GSTIN of Consignee only.
10.
 1. The Seller shall not assign the Contract in whole or part without obtaining the prior written consent of buyer.
 2. The Seller shall not sub-contract the Contract in whole or part to any entity without obtaining the prior written consent of buyer.
 3. The Seller shall, notwithstanding the consent and assignment/sub-contract, remain jointly and severally liable and responsible to buyer together with the assignee/ sub-contractor, for and in respect of the due performance of the Contract and the Sellers obligations there under.
11. Without prejudice to Buyer's right to price adjustment by way of discount or any other right or remedy available to Buyer, Buyer may terminate the Contract or any part thereof by a written notice to the Seller, if:

- i) The Seller fails to comply with any material term of the Contract.
 - ii) The Seller informs Buyer of its inability to deliver the Material(s) or any part thereof within the stipulated Delivery Period or such inability otherwise becomes apparent.
 - iii) The Seller fails to deliver the Material(s) or any part thereof within the stipulated Delivery Period and/or to replace/rectify any rejected or defective Material(s) promptly.
 - iv) The Seller becomes bankrupt or goes into liquidation.
 - v) The Seller makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors.
 - vi) A receiver is appointed for any substantial property owned by the Seller.
 - vii) The Seller has misrepresented to Buyer, acting on which misrepresentation Buyer has placed the Purchase Order on the Seller.
12. While generating invoice in GeM portal, the seller must upload scanned copy of GST invoice and the screenshot of GST portal confirming payment of GST.
 13. Scope of supply (Bid price to include all cost components) : Supply Installation Testing Commissioning of Goods and Training of operators and providing Statutory Clearances required (if any)
 14. Bidder Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the bidder during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the bidder is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria.
 15. OEM Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the OEM of the offered product during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the OEM is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria. In case of bunch bids, the OEM of CATEGORY RELATED TO primary product having highest bid value should meet this criterion.
 16. IMPORTED PRODUCTS: In case of imported products, OEM or Authorized Seller of OEM should have a registered office in India to provide after sales service support in India. The certificate to this effect should be submitted.
 17. Availability of Service Centres: Bidder/OEM must have a Functional Service Centre in the State of each Consignee's Location in case of carry-in warranty. (Not applicable in case of goods having on-site warranty). If service center is not already there at the time of bidding, successful bidder / OEM shall have to establish one within 30 days of award of contract. Payment shall be released only after submission of documentary evidence of having Functional Service Centre.
 18. Dedicated /toll Free Telephone No. for Service Support : BIDDER/OEM must have Dedicated/toll Free Telephone No. for Service Support.
 19. Escalation Matrix For Service Support : Bidder/OEM must provide Escalation Matrix of Telephone Numbers for Service Support.
 20. Bidder's offer is liable to be rejected if they don't upload any of the certificates / documents sought in the Bid document, ATC and Corrigendum if any.
 21. Material Test Certificate Should Be Sent Along with The Supply. The Material Will Be Checked by Buyer's Lab & the Results of the Lab will be the Sole Criteria for Acceptance of the Item.
 22. The bidder is required to upload, along with the bid, all relevant certificates such as BIS licence, type test certificate, approval certificates and other certificates as prescribed in the Product Specification given in the bid document.
 23. Warranty period of the supplied products shall be as given in specifications from the date of final acceptance of goods or after completion of installation, commissioning & testing of goods (if included in the scope of supply), at consignee location. OEM Warranty certificates must be submitted by Successful Bidder at the time of delivery of Goods. The seller should guarantee the rectification of goods in case of any break down during the guarantee period. Seller should have well established Installation, Commissioning, Training, Troubleshooting and Maintenance Service group in INDIA for attending the after sales service. Details of Service Centres near consignee destinations are to be uploaded along with the bid.
 24. **Proof for Past Experience and Project Experience clause:** For fulfilling the experience criteria any one of the following documents may be considered as valid proof for meeting the experience criteria:a. Contract copy along with Invoice(s) with self-certification by the bidder that service/supplies against the invoices have been executed.b. Execution certificate by client with contract value.c. Any other document in support of contract execution like Third Party Inspection release note, etc.Proof for Past Experience and

Project Experience clause: For fulfilling the experience criteria any one of the following documents may be considered as valid proof for meeting the experience criteria: a. Contract copy along with Invoice(s) with self-certification by the bidder that service/supplies against the invoices have been executed. b. Execution certificate by client with contract value. c. Any other document in support of contract execution like Third Party Inspection release note, etc.

25. The Bidder / OEM {themselves or through reseller(s)}, should have executed project for supply and installation / commissioning of same or similar Category Products during preceding 3 financial years (i.e. current year and three previous financial years) as on opening of bid, as per following criteria:
- (i) Single order of at least 35% of estimated bid value; or
 - (ii) Two orders of at least 20% each of estimated bid value; or
 - (iii) Three orders of at least 15% each of estimated bid value.
- Satisfactory Performance certificate issued by respective Buyer Organization for the above Orders should be uploaded with bid. In case of bunch bids, the Category related to primary product having highest bid value should meet this criterion
26. Successful Bidder can submit the Performance Security in the form of Account Payee Demand Draft also (besides PBG which is allowed as per GeM GTC). DD should be made in favour of Registrar, IIT Kanpur payable at Registrar. After award of contract, Successful Bidder can upload scanned copy of the DD in place of PBG and has to ensure delivery of hard copy to the original DD to the Buyer within 15 days of award of contract.
27. Bidders can also submit the EMD with Account Payee Demand Draft in favour of Registrar, IIT Kanpur payable at Registrar. Bidder has to upload scanned copy / proof of the DD along with bid and has to ensure delivery of hardcopy to the Buyer within 5 days of Bid End date / Bid Opening date.
28. **NET WORTH:** Net Worth of the OEM should be positive as per the last audited financial statement.
29. Buyer Added text based ATC clauses
1. Ensure to specify the Make & Model of the offered Item.
 2. Mere Reproduction of asked specification without any supporting official / printed brochure of the offered product may lead to rejection of bid.
 3. Quotations may be submitted only by the 'Original Equipment Manufacturer' or their 'Authorized Dealers'. Quotations from other than Authorized Dealers or Resellers will not be considered.
 4. Participating bidders can ignore the Make/Model/Brand name (if mentioned anywhere in bid document) while participating the bid. Bidders can quote for equivalent products in the bid.
 5. As per Make in India (MII) clause for Participating Class I Local Supplier: Bidders participating as Class-I Local Supplier (Minimum Local Content 50% or above) must submit the local content declaration/certificate issued from OEM only. Otherwise, Bidder would be treated as Class II Local Supplier.
 6. To validate the reasonableness of the quoted rates, the bidder(s) must submit a detailed price breakdown of the items listed in the past purchase orders pertaining to the same or similar items supplied to IITs/NITs/any other educational institutions in India. This breakdown must clearly specify the price of goods/services (Ex-works), handling, packing, shipping, insurance costs, foreign bank fee (LC), agency commission (INR), etc. Additionally, a comprehensive justification for the reasonableness of the quoted rates must be submitted.

Rate Reasonability Certificate: Submit a rate reasonability certificate duly filled, signed, and stamped on participating bidder letterhead. The same can be downloaded from the following link:-

8. This Item Consists Various Components/Parts/Sub Parts/Accessories (See Specifications or Full details) where BID is floated for 01 SET (So the Prices should be quoted accordingly that consist of all in 01 Set Prices)

9. Final quantity will be considered as per buyer uploaded bid specific ATC for each package (Package 1- 4). Quote your price accordingly.

Integrity Pact

1. Integrity Pact: The Integrity Pact will be applicable only for tenders valued above ₹1 crore.

2. In accordance with the Central Vigilance Commission's letter No.022/ VGL/078/546789 dated 04.05.2023 and the Ministry of Education's Notification No. C-34014/1/2022-Vig. dated 25.05.2023, the following persons have been appointed as Independent External Monitors (IEMs) for IIT Kanpur for three years: -

3. All bidders must submit a signed soft copy (online) of the Integrity Pact with their bid documents for tenders over ₹1 crore. However, only the L-1 bidder must then provide a hard copy on ₹100 non-judicial stamp paper before issuing the GeM Contract/PO, please see ATC Document and IP Document.

4. The Integrity Pact shall be part of the contract, and all parties are bound by its provisions.

5. The Institute reserves the right to cancel the tender at any stage without assigning any reason thereof.

6. If the Bidder does not submit the signed copy of the IP with Bid documents, the Bid will not be considered.

Corrigendum

Revised Clauses

i. Clause 10: Experience in Organizing Tinkering Competitions

"The Bidder should have conducted Tinkering competition where at least 100 schools should have participated in the last 3 years."

Revised Clause:

*"The Bidder should have conducted Tinkering competition where at least **50** schools should have participated in the last 3 years."*

ii. Clause 11: International Participation in Tinkering Competitions

"The Bidder should have conducted Tinkering competition where schools from different countries should have participated."

Revised Clause:

“The criterion mentioned at **Point No. 11 is hereby removed** from the eligibility requirements.”

iii. Clauses 18 and 19: Innovation Credentials (Trademarks and Patents)

18. *The bidder should have at least 2 Trade Marks in its name.*

19. *The bidder should have at least 2 Patents in its name.*

Revised Clause:

The bidder should have at least two (2) Trademarks **or** two (2) Patents, in its name.

All other terms and conditions of the original bid document remain unchanged.

This corrigendum shall form an integral part of the original bid document and must be duly acknowledged by all bidders.

Disclaimer

The additional terms and conditions have been incorporated by the Buyer after approval of the Competent Authority in Buyer Organization, whereby Buyer organization is solely responsible for the impact of these clauses on the bidding process, its outcome, and consequences thereof including any eccentricity / restriction arising in the bidding process due to these ATCs and due to modification of technical specifications and / or terms and conditions governing the bid. If any clause(s) is / are incorporated by the Buyer regarding following, the bid and resultant contracts shall be treated as null and void and such bids may be cancelled by GeM at any stage of bidding process without any notice:-

1. Definition of Class I and Class II suppliers in the bid not in line with the extant Order / Office Memorandum issued by DPIIT in this regard.
2. Seeking EMD submission from bidder(s), including via Additional Terms & Conditions, in contravention to exemption provided to such sellers under GeM GTC.
3. Publishing Custom / BOQ bids for items for which regular GeM categories are available without any Category item bunched with it.
4. Creating BoQ bid for single item.
5. Mentioning specific Brand or Make or Model or Manufacturer or Dealer name.
6. Mandating submission of documents in physical form as a pre-requisite to qualify bidders.
7. Floating / creation of work contracts as Custom Bids in Services.
8. Seeking sample with bid or approval of samples during bid evaluation process. (However, in bids for [attached categories](#), trials are allowed as per approved procurement policy of the buyer nodal Ministries)
9. Mandating foreign / international certifications even in case of existence of Indian Standards without specifying equivalent Indian Certification / standards.
10. Seeking experience from specific organization / department / institute only or from foreign / export experience.
11. Creating bid for items from irrelevant categories.
12. Incorporating any clause against the MSME policy and Preference to Make in India Policy.
13. Reference of conditions published on any external site or reference to external documents/clauses.
14. Asking for any Tender fee / Bid Participation fee / Auction fee in case of Bids / Forward Auction, as the case may be.
15. Buyer added ATC Clauses which are in contravention of clauses defined by buyer in system generated bid template as indicated above in the Bid Details section, EMD Detail, ePBG Detail and MII and MSE Purchase Preference sections of the bid, unless otherwise allowed by GeM GTC.

16. In a category based bid, adding additional items, through buyer added additional scope of work/ additional terms and conditions/or any other document. If buyer needs more items along with the main item, the same must be added through bunching category based items or by bunching custom catalogs or bunching a BoQ with the main category based item, the same must not be done through ATC or Scope of Work.

Further, if any seller has any objection/grievance against these additional clauses or otherwise on any aspect of this bid, they can raise their representation against the same by using the Representation window provided in the bid details field in Seller dashboard after logging in as a seller within 4 days of bid publication on GeM. Buyer is duty bound to reply to all such representations and would not be allowed to open bids if he fails to reply to such representations.
