## Part A

1. Write a sentence with a word from the word family 'boil' using two objects. Which is the (i) direct and (ii) indirect object? Write the passive voice in two ways by interchanging the position of the objects.
2. Use the verbs in the appropriate ways using 'would', 'should', 'have to' or 'must'.

5. Frame some contexts or questions in which the following otherwise incomplete sentences will make sense.
(i) His son was. (ii) This time they are.
6. There is an ambiguity in the following sentence in one form of its passive voice. Show that and explain how it is ambiguous.
They quoted Shakespeare to me.
7. Use two transitive verbs from the word family 'ruin' and write them as intransitive in two different sentences.
